ADVISEMENT INFORMATION FOR TRANSFER MAJORS

ENGLISH (CSUF, CSULB, SDSU, UCI, UCLA)

The study of English as a major discipline is composed of two different areas of concentration: literature, and composition and writing. Literature explores the fiction, dramas, and poetry of different cultures. It involves criticism of the literature being studied.

Literature majors can study writings from a number of different time periods and cultures, or concentrate on a broad, deep understanding of just one area, such as Renaissance poetry or 20th-century French novels. Literature can be studied as a source of psychological and social insight as well as an art.

Composition and writing deals with the mechanics of language, the structure of types of compositions, grammar rhetoric (theory behind the composition), and the creative writing process. Courses in these areas deal not only with subjects, but also with how to teach them.

Listed below are Saddleback College (SC) courses that have been articulated with selected example universities, and represents lower-division preparation for the major. In addition, students are advised to complete General Education requirements prior to transfer.

Articulation agreements can change without notice at any point during your time at Saddleback College. Please refer to the college catalogs and websites of the transfer schools you are considering, as well as the state-wide articulation database for CSU and UC campuses, www.assist.org, for the most current information. Students are urged to contact a Saddleback College counselor to review this information on a regular basis.

****English 1A and at least twelve (12) units from the following recommended courses may be selected.*** In addition to English 1A, students must complete at least 30 units of upper-division coursework after transfer to fulfill the 42 units required for the major. Students are urged to consult with a faculty advisor in the Department of English and Comparative Literature at CSUF.

CSU LONG BEACH

BACHELOR OF ARTS IN ENGLISH

The Department of English offers five (5) bachelor's degree options: Creative Writing; English Education; Literature; Rhetoric and Composition; and Special Emphasis.

NOTE: *Each lower-division course counted towards the English major must be completed with a grade of "C" or better. A course in which a grade lower than a "C" is received must be retaken and successfully completed prior to enrolling in any course for which it is a prerequisite.*

Creative Writing Option - Requirements: ENG (4 or 5), 17A, 17B

BACHELOR OF ARTS IN ENGLISH

English Education Option - Requirements: ENG (17A or 17B), ENG (15A OR 15B); (ENG 21B or 27B or TA 25 or TA 26); ENG 44; TA 20; SP 1; **AND students must complete twelve (12) units from one of the following nine (9) emphases below to provide breadth and perspective. A portion of the twelve unit requirement will be upper-division units taken at CSU Long Beach; the lower-division portion is listed below:**

Black Studies Emphasis: ENG 23A; **Communication Studies Emphasis:** All courses are upper-division.; **Creative Writing Emphasis:** All courses are upper-division.; **Journalism Emphasis:** JRN 2; **Language and Linguistics Emphasis:** All courses are upper-division.; **Literacy and Composition Emphasis:** All courses are upper-division.; **Literature Emphasis:** All courses are upper-division; **Theatre Arts Emphasis:** TA 1; **World Literature Emphasis:** ENG 44

Literature Option - Requirements: ENG 17A, 17B; ENG 15A, 15B

Rhetoric and Composition Option - Requirements: ENG 17A, 17B, 15A, 15B, 1B (ENG 1B recommended.)

Special Emphasis Option: *Students wishing to pursue this option are required to consult with a faculty advisor in the Department of English.*

Lower-Division Preparation for the Major: ENG (15A or 15B), 17A, 17B; ENG 1B; **AND one (1) course from:** ENG 25; ENG 3; (4 or 5), 21A, 21B

Foreign Language Requirement: Proficiency equivalent to a Foreign Language level 3 is required, (Examples: FR 3, GER 3, SPAN 3, SL 3 at Saddleback College.)

BACHELOR OF ARTS ENGLISH – SINGLE SUBJECT TEACHING

The major in English in Preparation for the Single Subject Teaching Credential in English Language Arts is designated as an impacted program and specific criteria are used to admit students. Refer to the San Diego State University catalog, ASSIST at www.assist.org, and the English program website at <http://arweb.sdsu.edu/es/admissions/ab/english.htm> for selection criteria and GPA requirements.

Lower-Division Preparation for the Major: ENG 1A, 1B, SP 1; ENG 25 or 21A or 21B; JRN 1 or CA 1; ENG 44; ENG (15A and 15B) or ENG (17A and 17B); ENG 3

Foreign Language Requirement: Proficiency equivalent to a Foreign Language level 3 is required, (Examples: FR 3, GER 3, SPAN 3, SL 3 at Saddleback College.)

UC IRVINE

BACHELOR OF ARTS IN ENGLISH

NOTE: *In fulfillment of the requirements below, a single course may be used only once.*

Lower-Division Requirements for the Major: Select two (2) courses from: ENG 15A, 15B, 17A, 17B, 21A, 21B, 25, 27A, 27B;

Two (2) years in a single language other than English at university level (or equivalent): Arabic, French, German, Italian, Persian, or Spanish 4

School Core Requirements: Select at least one (1) course from each of the following areas:

Writing: ENG 1A, 1B

Literature: ENG 15A, 15B, 17A, 17B, 21A, 21B, 25, 27A, 27B

History: HIST 4, 5, 7, 8, 16, 17, 19, 27, 28, 62, 63, 70, 71, 74, 75

Philosophy: PHIL 1, PHIL 15 or ENG (1A and ENG 1B and HUM 10A; HUM 10B) or (ENG 1A and ENG1B, **AND two (2) courses from:** HUM 1, 2, 3)

UC LOS ANGELES

BACHELOR OF ARTS IN ENGLISH

IMPORTANT: *Students should complete as many preparation courses as possible prior to transfer. All courses (except for the foreign language courses) must be taken for a letter grade.* For more information regarding this major and UCLA's transfer selection process, visit: www.english.ucla.edu and www.admissions.ucla.edu

NOTE: *Transfer students who have satisfied the UCLA College (Letters and Science) foreign language requirement at the high school level through the IGETC program, may satisfy the departmental foreign language requirement with five (5) foreign literature in translation courses.*

Lower-Division Preparation: ENG 1A, (1B and 25); ENG (17A and 17B)

Foreign Language Preparation: (4th semester of one (1) foreign language) **OR** (2nd semester of one (1) foreign language and two (2) additional courses in foreign language or foreign literature, including foreign literature in translation.) **Literature in translation courses include:** ENG 21A, 21B, 44

NOTE: *Humanities 1 will not be accepted for this major for students transferring to UCLA after Fall 2007.*

NOTES:

- As each college/university has its own orientation to their English major, read the entire English major section in the catalog of each college/university to which you are considering transferring. Pay particular attention to the upper-division requirements.
- Contact each college/university that you are interested in. Ask them to send you information about their English program; selection criteria, GPA requirements, and other pertinent admissions information. Also, ask for information about their campus, services, housing, etc. Meet with college/university representatives when they visit Saddleback College.
- Visit each school to which you are considering transferring.
