HISTORY (CSUF, CSULB, UCB, UCI, UCLA)

History is both the study and the research of major social, political, cultural, and economic events of the past. It encompasses almost all aspects of human activity and behavior. Applying the results of historical study is important for the preservation and future growth of nations and institutions. Knowledge of the past can enable individuals to develop pride and appreciation for the accomplishments of others. History majors are prepared for a wide variety of careers such as: law, teaching, government service, politics, journalism, publishing, and public policy.

U.S. History (6 units): (HIST 16 **and** 17) **or** (HIST 16 **and** 22) **or** (HIST 17 **and** 22) **or** (HIST 16 **and** *20/SOC 20) **or** (HIST 17 **and** *20/SOC 20)

***NOTE:** HIST/SOC 20 does not fulfill American Institutions requirement.

World Civilization (6 units): HIST 4, 5

CSU LONG BEACH

BACHELOR OF ARTS IN HISTORY

To fulfill State of California requirements, students must take three (3) units of U.S. History. This requirement can be met by taking HIST 16 or HIST (17 or 19) at Saddleback College.

Lower-Division Preparation:

Select nine (9) units of lower-division history courses from the following: HIST 4, 5, *16, (*17 or 19), 62, 63

***NOTE:** HIST 16 or HIST 17 at Saddleback College can be counted toward the lower-division requirement and the General Education requirement.

IMPORTANT: History majors are strongly encouraged to include the study of foreign language and literature in their programs. Also, lower-division History courses not listed above can be counted toward the 9-unit requirement only at the discretion of the CSULB History Advisor.

UC BERKELEY

BACHELOR OF ARTS IN HISTORY

By the end of the spring term preceding fall enrollment at Berkeley, you must complete either: 1) The College of Letters and Science requirements in Reading & Composition, Foreign Language, and Quantitative Reasoning; or 2) IGETC

NOTE: AP scores cannot be used to satisfy major requirements.

Lower-Division Requirements for the Major

Select one (1) course from each of the following four (4) areas:

1) United States: HIST 16, 17; **2) Europe/Western Civilization:** HIST 4, 5; **3) Asia, Africa or Latin America:** HIST 30, (HIST 70 or 71 or 72), (HIST 75 or PS 75), (HIST 80 or PS 80); **4) Elective:** Select an additional course from any of the above areas other than a course previously taken to fulfill requirements.

BACHELOR OF ARTS IN HISTORY

NOTE: *In fulfillment of the requirements below, a single course may be used only once.*

Lower-Division Requirements for the Major

Select two (2) courses from two (2) different regions: [A third course in another region will be taken at UCI.]

Asia: HIST 70, 71; **Europe:** HIST 62, 63; **Latin America:** HIST 27, 28; **Middle East and Africa:** HIST 74, (HIST 75 or PS 75), (HIST 80 or PS 80); **United States:** HIST 7, 8, 16, 17; **World History:** HIST 4, 5; **AND select up to three (3) additional UC-transferable history courses.**

Select at least one (1) course from each area (writing, literature, history, and philosophy):

Writing: ENG 1A, 1B; **Literature:** ENG 15A, 15B, 17A, 17B, 21A, 21B, 25, 27A, 27B; **History:** HIST 4, 5, 7, 8, 16, 17, 19, 27, 28, 62, 63, 70, 71, 74, 75; **Philosophy:** PHIL 1, 15; **or** (ENG 1A and 1B and HUM 10A and 10B); **or** (ENG 1A and 1B) **Two courses from HUM 1, HUM 2, HUM 3.**

Foreign Language Requirement:

ARAB 4 or FR 4 or GER 4 or ITA 4 or PRSN 4 or SPAN 4.

Lower-Division Preparation:

Select one (1) course from: (HIST 4 or 5 or 62 or 63); **AND select two (2) courses from:** HIST 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, 15, 16, 17, 19, (HIST 20 or SOC 20), 21, 22, 25, 27, 28, 30, 32, 33, 40, 41, (HIST 61 or PS 61), 70, 71, 72, 74, (HIST 75 or PS 75), (HIST 80 or PS 80), 81

NOTES:

- As each college/university has its own orientation to their Architecture/Environmental Design major, read the entire Architecture/Environmental Design major section in the catalog of each college/university to which you are considering transferring. Pay particular attention to the upper-division requirements.
- Contact each college/university that you are interested in. Ask them to send you information about their Architecture/Environmental Design program; selection criteria, GPA requirements, and other pertinent admissions information. Also ask for information about their campus, services, housing, etc. Meet with college/university representatives when they visit Saddleback College.
- Visit each school to which you are considering transferring. Research careers related to your chosen major.
