

DEGREE INFORMATION

Associate of Science Degree in Child Development

Completion of the certificate program and a minimum of 60 units including the general education requirements with an overall GPA of 2.0 qualifies the student for the Associate in Science degree. A minimum of 12 units must be completed at Saddleback College. With an AA degree in Child Development students can qualify for a site supervisor permit if they take the following courses in addition to their degree requirements: CD 127, CD 128, and CD 129.

Transfer Information

Students intending to transfer must complete IGETC or CSU pattern general education courses. See current schedule or catalog for course lists.

IMPORTANT NOTE:

Students who began coursework prior to Fall 2009 may use the requirements in effect for the academic year in which they began or move up to the current list, which ever meets their needs most effectively.

Students who began coursework prior to Fall 2005 **MUST** move up to current requirements. All previously taken coursework will apply to newer certificates/degrees. Some course names have changed. Check department website for complete information.

WHAT CAN I DO WITH A SCHOOL-AGE CARE AND RECREATION CERTIFICATE?

This certificate meets the coursework requirements for the **Teacher** level of the California Child Development Permit on the school-age matrix and prepares students to be competent and effective caregivers and recreation leaders for children ages 6-12.

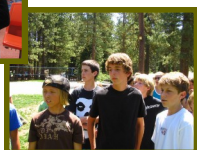
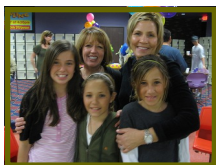
Additional work experience with young children (175 days of 3 hours per day within 4 years) may be required to qualify for state permit. This Saddleback Certificate can be earned with coursework only.

Students are encouraged to apply for BOTH the college certificate and the state permit. See the Child Development website for application information.

Complete all core courses, supervised field experience, including all prerequisite courses and specified general education courses to earn your certificate. A minimum grade of "C" in each course is required to receive the certificate.

Qualifies you for careers working directly or indirectly with children in related fields such as:

- Before & After School Caregiver
- Recreation Leader
- Youth Group Leader
- Children's Advocacy
- Children's Book Author

Lab placement must be in an approved setting that serves children ages 6-12 (with a qualified supervising teacher) .
