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# B. Board Policies/Administrative Regulations Update

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- Dan Walsh shared that the follow ARs/BPs are going to the BPARC meeting on October 25<sup>th</sup>:
  - 1. BP/AR 4410 Honorary Degrees: changing from the Trustees to Board of Trustees
  - 2. BP 4400 Community Education Programs: no change information only
  - **3. AR 7210 Academic Assignments for Management Team:** if an administrator wants to teach a class they need permission from Academic Senate; senate will reach out to the chair
  - **4. AR 7345 Catastrophic Leave Program:** Dan encourages everyone to look at this AR.
  - **5. BP 7350 Resignations:** Single change at the end, encourages employees to have an exit interview when they leave their job.

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### C. Curriculum Update

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Anwar Hijaz shared the following information from Curriculum Chair Michelle Duffy:

- AB 1111 Common Course Numbering (CCN)
  - Phase I courses: All course revisions have been submitted to Curriculum and are ready to move forward for local approval before being sent to the state for chaptering.
  - Phase II courses: Deans and department chairs were emailed about the upcoming convenings and course surveys

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The next window for submission of new courses and programs is in the spring.

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#### D. Senate Bylaws Update

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Dan Walsh presented the Bylaws of the Academic Senate of Saddleback College, highlighting recent changes. The term for the President has been reverted to a two-year term, and no formal vote is necessary if only one faculty member submits their candidacy. Additionally, Item 9 now includes a section on Committee Chairs. Dan clarified that while no voting will take place today, Senators are encouraged to propose additions and changes, with a vote on the Bylaws scheduled for the next meeting.

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#### **10. NEW BUSINESS**

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# A. Fall 2024 ASCCC Plenary

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- Dan Walsh shared that the ASCCC meets twice a year to serve two main purposes: to provide educational opportunities and to create resolutions that guide and advocate for California Community Colleges. This year's meeting will be held on November 7th and 8th in Visalia, California. One of the proposed resolutions aims to clarify Student Learning Outcomes (SLOs). Margot Lovett discussed the difference between course objectives and student learning outcomes, highlighting how this resolution will address existing confusion.
- Dan encouraged everyone to review the resolutions, which will be posted on the
  ASCCC website on October 24th. Frank Gonzalez inquired how SLO resolutions might
  affect common course numbering. Margot acknowledged this as an important question
  that needs further exploration, noting that Michelle Gustafson could provide more
  insight. Bruce Gilman asked whether there is public access to the ASCCC meeting. Dan
  responded that there is no public access, but the Area D meeting is open to the public,
  and he can share the link.

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# **B.** Topics for Future Senate Meetings

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Dan Walsh initiated a conversation about upcoming meetings and asked: What topics do the Senators want to see brought up, addressed, presented, etc., at future Academic Senate meetings? Examples mentioned included AI and DEIA, which is a campus-wide initiative. Margot Lovett clarified that for a topic to be included on the agenda, it must fall under the Senate's purview as outlined in the 10 + 1. Senators are encouraged to email Dan Walsh with any topics they would like to cover.
