#### D. Middle College Update

Margot Lovett shared that since our last meeting there have been two important findings: (1) the faculty contract contains a clause that faculty must consent to teaching a dual enrollment, middle college course and (2) the confirmed location will be Village 8. The membership of the planning team: Kari Irwin, Margot Lovett, Jennifer LaBounty, Jess Kaven, Cory Wathen, Chantelle Gil, and Erin Long. The planning team met on November 4<sup>th</sup> and reviewed the guiding principles as developed by the Feasibility Taskforce. Each guiding principle was aligned to the College's strategic plan and area/individuals responsible for its implementation were assigned.

### Next steps:

- Capo will come to do a tour with their facilities people and an MOU (memorandum of understanding) will be worked out to address any changes needed. Capo will be financially responsible.
- Feb 21<sup>st</sup>- all day tour of San Diego's Health Science Middle College campus
- Capo's principal would like to meet with Erin and Jennifer to talk about programming

#### Questions:

- Intended start date? Potentially fall 2025, but it may need to be pushed out
- Location? Village 8; several senators were concerned with this location since it
  is near the police station- students, especially this community of students, will
  not feel safe since they equate police with immigration; the village is a terrible
  facility; Village 8 is the only nice classroom- why not the others that need
  renovation? Comp Sci does not want to lose Village 8- this could be a working
  conditions issue
- Who decided on the location? It was discussed last year in Senate and a large majority voted for the Village as the location; senators were reminded that dropping off/picking up students was also a factor in selecting the Village
- If the location cannot be changed, is there a way to mitigate the how police presence impacts students? Can't be addressed now
- Can we delay until our new building is complete? It is likely the Middle College will not be ready to go until fall 2026 based on how fast Capo is moving at this point
- Limited to underrepresented students? Who can apply? This is a question for Capo
